

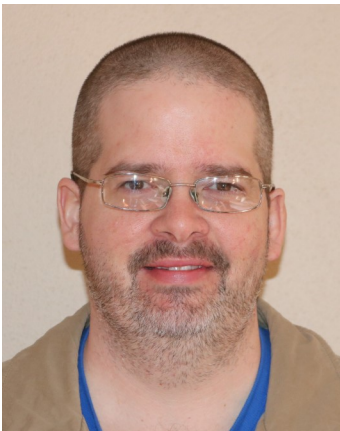

When the DOC's (Department of Correction's) plans for my parole went suddenly away, I found myself allowed to come to Kingdom Boundaries when the prison had told me "no" twice before. I believe God was letting me know that He engineered this as I had already exhausted every earthly avenue, I could think of to be allowed to come to KB.

I have come to consider Jeff, Rhonda, Kevin, and Tim my friends. (Family in Christ.) While here I have experienced sincere care for my wellbeing – spiritual, physical, emotional, financial, and legal. The staff provides concise, effective guidance and assistance with any number of real-world concerns and responsibilities.

What staff does to help us seems clearly born out of a commitment to living out God's calling for them. Through our walk together they remain Christ-focused and encourage us to do likewise. While possessing compassion and understanding, staff is clear that we are to live in accordance with God's Word, the laws of the land, and the rules and terms we agree to when joining KBPA. Consequences for choices and actions exist, as they should.

I felt welcome in any office at KB, (this is important) and the earnestness and Christian caring of the staff helped me feel that I could come to them with any problem, struggle, fear, or confusion that I might have. Coming out of years in a place that is often cold and impersonal, I cannot overstate how much of a blessing this is.

Kingdom Boundaries has fostered in me a sense of confidence, self-worth, and belonging which I have no doubt will be paramount in my success on parole, in life, and as a Christian. I find such things in Christ Jesus, to whom KBPA is constantly and consistently pointing us.
